

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

In line with the latest advice from Commonwealth and WA governments, St Anne's is planning to remain open at least until the end of term to provide the best possible education to your children. In line with Prime Minister's and the WA Minister for Education's advice, parents may choose to keep their children at home during this unprecedented time.

State and territory Premiers and Chief Ministers have committed to the Australian Health Protection Principal Committee advice that says that it is safe to keep schools open.

In considering the potential risks associated with COVID-19, our school has been working with Catholic Education Western Australia in conjunction with the WA Department of Health and the Department of Education throughout the evolution of COVID-19 to ensure we have the best possible preparedness and response strategies in place.

We are working hard to ensure our teaching and learning continuity plan supports students to engage in remote learning should our school be required to close. Those students who are not attending school because parents have chosen not to send them will be able to engage with their learning in the following ways:

Kindergarten to Year Three: *Children will bring home a work pack tomorrow afternoon. This work pack contains two weeks worth of work. These packs will be supplemented with online learning tools, such as, Seesaw, Mathletics and Reading Eggs. Your child's teacher will continue to communicate with you via Seesaw. If your child returns to school throughout the remaining weeks, they will need to bring their work pack with them. If your child is currently being kept at home, you will need to **collect your child's work pack from outside their classroom tomorrow afternoon from 2pm.** It is a requirement that these packs are returned to school on Thursday 9th April.*

Children who continue to attend school will engage in the daily classroom learning experiences.

Year 4 – 6 Students: *For the remainder of Term 1, your child's teacher has provided general learning activities online via Teams. Learning experiences may be supplemented with online learning tools, such as Sumdog, Epic Reading and Accelerated Reader. Completed tasks can be uploaded to each child's private Teams Channel. **Hard copy work packs will be made available for all students and can be collected tomorrow afternoon outside of the classrooms from 2pm.** If your child returns to school throughout the remaining weeks, they will need to bring their work pack with them.*

All work not returned digitally, needs to be returned on Thursday 9th April.

Children who continue to attend school will engage in the daily classroom learning experiences.

Please be assured that while the school remains open, social distancing will be enforced and cleaning regimes will continue to be completed to the highest possible standards to mitigate risks associated with the spread of the COVID-19 virus. I ask that you also have conversations with your child about the importance of these measures. If your child is feeling unwell in any way, please keep them at home.

In acknowledging the far-reaching impact of COVID-19 for families in our school community, I also assure parents that we remain determined that no family seeking a Catholic education for their child be denied the opportunity due to financial difficulty. Catholic Education Western Australia is addressing potential concerns relating to fees and affordability that may arise as a result of COVID-19.

COVID-19 is a changing situation that is affecting many areas of our lives, and it is normal for all of us to feel anxious and worried, your child included.

Our teachers and other school staff are doing a wonderful job in providing pastoral support to students at this challenging time. It is important to remember that as parents, you can help your child process all the information they are receiving and the changes that are taking place around COVID-19. You can stay informed and provide factual, age appropriate information about COVID-19 that will help your child feel informed and empowered, rather than afraid.

Everyone in the community has a part to play in helping control the spread of COVID-19. We will continue to follow the latest advice of the Department of Health. I will keep you informed about any changes for our school as updates become available.

Thank you for your support at this time, and as a Catholic community I encourage all of you to pray for those coordinating our response in Australia, and for all of those in Australia and abroad affected by COVID-19.

As always, I ask that you contact me directly if you have any concern that may relate to your child.
