Dear Students, Parents and Friends of St Anne's,

Welcome to the newsletter for this week.

This included a prayer service, house activities and a shared lunch. A lot of fun seemed to be had from the students with some great activities prepared by the staff, however, the liturgy celebrating the life of Mother Mary was a highlight and truly depicted the significance of Mary in our lives and the virtues and values she empowered in her own life.

HARVEY BEEF - THANKYOU: In support of our school initiatives Harvey Beef recently donated sausages that were able to be used at the Election sausage sizzle as well as Korijekup Feast day. On behalf of the students of St Anne's, this generous donation was very much appreciated.

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NEW SCHOOL BARBECUE: Thankyou to Michelle and Andrew Stacey for your generous donation of a brand spanking new barbecue for our school. I've got to say it is a beauty and will no doubt be well used within our school for many years to come.

HIGH TEA: What a magnificent turn out of 'mums, grandmums and significant others' to the P & F High Tea in the Parish Centre last week. Visiting the venue, it was amazing to see the transformation of a Hall into a....well not a Hall! The seating, tablework, food, artistry, creativity etc. was awesome and really set a great tone for the day. There was some initial reluctance and concern from the organisers around attendance but there was really nothing to worry about with approximately 90 people attending.

Through the kind donation of food from our parents, prizes from the community and time from our P & F, total monies raised from the day was in the vicinity of \$3700.

This is staggering with all proceeds going back to the school. An upgrade of IT equipment in the Hall is hopefully going to be a beneficiary of this fundraiser.

I know it was a team effort from the P & F but particular thanks and well done to Jess Green and Louise Downey for your work in making the High Tea happen. I have been 'told' by a few sources that this may become a biannual event, which will be a great community opportunity for our school in years to come.

LIFE SKILLS FOR LIFE: A great opportunity for our Year Five and Six students this week to receive skills and understanding in First Aid. Presented by Surf Life Saving WA, students took part in an interactive resuscitation workshop that will hopefully equip them with knowledge, skills and confidence to effectively respond in a first aid or emergency situation. This is a great initiative that our school takes part in, upskilling our students in vital Life skills for aiding in the survival of others.

NAPLAN: NAPLAN was completed by our Year Three and Five students last week and in comparison to other schools who completed the online version, we were relatively unaffected. When I say relatively, there were some connectivity issues in the writing assessment but these were able to be managed with Mr Godwin successfully 'troubleshooting' his way through the process, allowing our students to complete the assessment. This is a win for us as we were nervous in terms of our own infrastructure and capabilities to complete testing digitally.

Thankyou to Mrs Patty Vogel for her work in directing and shaping our school as we transform to a digital space and take on the challenges of digital technology. Also thankyou to Mr Godwin, for his efforts, sacrifice and diligence in overseeing the installation, management and implementation of NAPLAN online. Thankyou also, to Miss Cox and Mrs Fimmano for their work within their classrooms in preparing our students.

To complete these tests really required an additional skill set from our students in terms of utilisation of the Ipad. This had previously been, and will continue to be a skill set that will need to be developed in all our students in years to come.

Results will be released later in the year.

PUPIL FREE DAYS: For future planning, please note that the day after the Long weekend in June (Tuesday 4th of June) will be a Pupil Free day. The last day of Term Two (Friday 5th July) will also be a professional development day for staff. Therefore the last day of Term Two for students will be Thursday 4th July 2019.

MAKING JESUS REAL: The Spirit of Jesus continues to be a 'theme' celebrated within our school. Please take note of the 'Making Jesus Real tip of the week.' By changing our behaviours and attitudes to live more like Jesus we can definitely make a difference to other individual's circumstances, as well as our own.
