EMERGENCY PROCEDURES:

The school has recently reviewed and updated our Critical Incident Management Procedures, including the use of our new PA system to support emergency responses.

We will continue to assess risks and implement safety measures to ensure a secure and supportive environment for all our students.

An important part of this process is ensuring that students understand what to do in various situations. As such, we regularly practise emergency procedures and educate students on appropriate responses.

This week, we practised a “Shelter in Place” procedure. This process is used to keep students safely inside their classrooms when a potential risk is identified within the school environment.

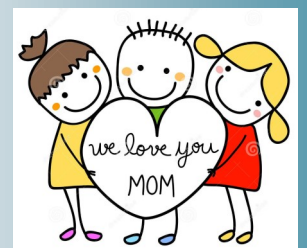
