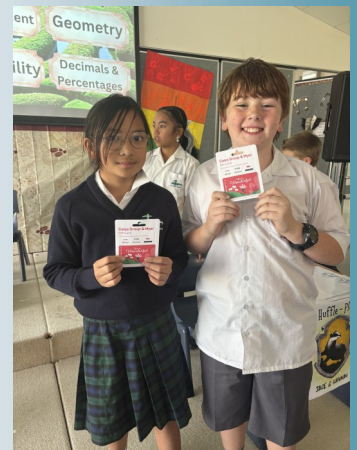
The Grand Quadwizard Trials

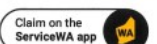

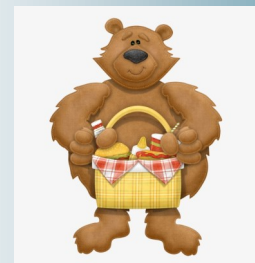
